The following courses are popular general education course choices among SEBS First Year Students:

Humanities and Arts

Environmental Design Analysis 11:550:230 (3) - Analysis of the quality of the physical environment: perception, awareness, design, and planning process. Governmental controls that affect quality. Private, public, urban, rural, and recreational environments considered.

Theater Appreciation (Additional Fee for Tickets Applied to Term Bill) 07:965:211 (3) - Designed for non-majors. Students attend a wide spectrum of theater offerings: Broadway, Off-Broadway, Off-Off-Broadway, repertory, and university theater performances and, through discussion and lectures by professional artists, gain an appreciation of performance.

Current Moral and Social Issues 01:730:105 (3) OR 01:730:106 (4) - Application of moral theory to selected issues. Possible topics include abortion, infanticide, euthanasia, punishment, equality, sexism, racism, affirmative action, privacy, obligations to the world's needy, treatment of animals, drug use, and the meaning of life. / 01:730:106 is the same with smaller weekly discussion meetings, enabling students to develop their oral argumentative skills and to pursue issues discussed in lectures.

Multicultural & International Studies

Intro to Human Ecology 11:374:101 (3) - The study of complex and varied patterns of interaction between people and the environment, with special attention to concepts, concerns, and methods of human ecology.

Intro to Cultural Anthropology 01:070:101 (4) - History of cultural anthropology; changing theoretical and methodological approaches; fieldwork, ethnographic writing, and the culture concept; cross-cultural analyses and comparisons; complex society; local, regional, and global perspectives.

Economic Systems

Economics, People, and Environment 11:373:101 (3) - Applications of economic concepts to problems related to environmental and other social problems. Topics include opportunity cost, marginal analysis, supply and demand, cost-benefit analysis, fiscal and monetary policies, and international trade. *Not open to students who have completed a term of microeconomics or macroeconomics.*

Principles and Applications of Microeconomics 11:373:121 (3) - Economic principles, laws, processes, and institutions of a free-enterprise economy with applications to contemporary economic life. Emphasis on individuals and firms within the economic system that bring about resource allocation.

Human Behavior

Intro to Human Evolution 01:070:102 (4) - Evolutionary processes, including adaptation and speciation; fossil and archaeological records of human morphological and social-behavioral evolution.

General Psychology (3) 01:830:101 (3) - Survey of main areas of contemporary psychology.

Political Processes

Nature of Politics 01:790:101 (3) - Crucial issues in politics: individual and community; political obligation and civil disobedience; stability, revolution, and change; legitimacy and justice; freedom and power.

American Government 01:790:104 (3) - Comprehensive analysis of American political institutions. Issues and problems faced by federal, state, and local governments under the impact of modern conditions. The leading political, economic, and social influences affecting democratic government.

Byrne Family First Year Seminars 01:090:101/11:090:101 (1) - Focusing on the research and interests of the faculty and introducing students to the range of intellectual and career possibilities offered to them at Rutgers. *For first-year students. Graded Pass/No Credit.*
